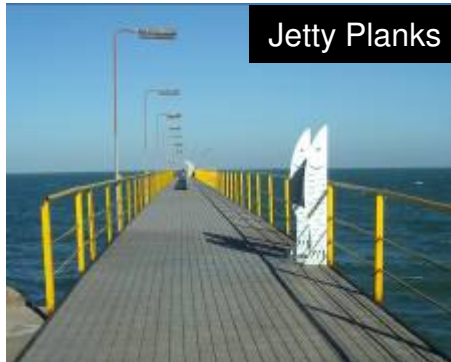

Whyalla Cuttlefish Experience

Every year between May and September, divers descend on Whyalla, SA to experience nature at its best; the spawning migration of the Giant Australian Cuttlefish. However, for many years the divers had been complaining about the entry point at Point Lowly. They had nowhere to prepare for the dive and would sometimes damage their expensive dive suits while entering or exiting the water.

As this diving experience has been gaining more and more international attention, the City of Whyalla decided to do something about the problem and chose to build a boardwalk into the sea. After considering several products, the council decided to use recycled plastic materials for their longevity, minimal maintenance and ease of installation. As you can see from the images above, this project has been an outstanding success.

Custom-made, recycled plastic bin surrounds are an attractive way to secure wheeled bins which would normally look out of place on the beautiful Rottnest Island.





Brisbane City Council had been faced with a problem in the Mt Coot-tha Botanical Gardens for some time. The original bitumen pathway had been damaged by the park's extensive tree root systems. The pathway needed constant maintenance and was losing its aesthetic appeal. The solution was to use recycled plastic boardwalk planking, which has now been installed into the ever-changing ecosystem. This is an ideal product for this environment as the plastic boardwalk planking is flexible, and therefore allows for movement. As seen above, the end result looks fantastic and will be around for visitors to the gardens to enjoy for many years.
